Principal's Yarn

School clean up - Thank you to all those parents who gave of their time to make our grounds look so good - the staff appreciate your ongoing support. The plantings on the embankment are native plants purchased from the funds raised by the SRC and are native varieties researched by the SRC as well.

Buildings update – Currently we are still awaiting a sign off to the remediation work done on building C. Since the last newsletter update, further remediation work has been completed. I'd like to thank our kindy team, Ms. Dragutinovic and Ms. Perry for their adaptability and resourcefulness in their continual delivery of programs to all K-6 students. I am awaiting reports and remediation plans for buildings A and B (the year 1 and 2 classes building and the heritage building respectively) to ascertain what work is going to be completed and the proposed timeframe for this.

SDD term 2 - Staff will complete mandated department of education professional learning focused on the new curriculum. This will include work around disability planning and adjustment as well as EALD training (English as an Additional Language or Dialect).

EV - As I have mentioned previously, Erko will be undergoing an External Validation process on Tuesday May 7 (week 2 term 2). This has been a major piece of work for our school over the course of this term and I'd like to publicly acknowledge the work of the executive team in ensuring we made our deadline. Thank you, team!

Open classrooms - Wonderful to see so many parents in rooms this week sharing in their child's learning journey and looking at just some of the work completed thus far this year. Really impressed with the progression of each of our bands too - Thanks to Ryley and Sam for the dedication and expertise in bringing on the bands and Ms. Cecire for her organisation.

Double parking - Can I remind parents that double parking is a dangerous practice and I'd hate for anyone in our community to be hurt from this. Also, please be considerate of our neighbours who are impacted by this practice.

You may have read a lot of stories in the press recently regarding issues related to staffing and infrastructure. At this stage I'm not sure what the implications may be for either of these areas as we await proposed changes. What I am certain of is that whatever happens, the staff here will meet it head on and provide the same level of quality education and care to our students that they always have. I am very proud of our staff and their efforts everyday in ensuring that your child is supported and educated to meet their potential.



It was the Training Band's first concert and it went very well for their first. They played: Hot Cross Buns, Mary had a Little Lamb and Kelpie.




