Principal's Message

Leadership speeches – The first component of electing the 2024 leadership team was completed this week with 19 candidates putting forward their names to be considered for Captaincy, Vice Captaincy, and Prefect positions. I was impressed with the poise and polish on display by all our candidates in both their speeches and presentation. Once again, the decision will be a difficult one but one that will result in Erko having an excellent leadership team who will lead and support the wider student body.

Kindy orientation - It was a pleasure to meet so many new (and returning!) faces with the first of our orientation activities for our Kindy's of 2024. My thanks to Ms. Russo for her organisation and Ms. Sallway and Ms. O'Connor for their contributions to making the information session a success. Special mention to our stage 3 students who were instrumental in helping support our new students and guiding our new community members to rooms and general support in admin - a perfect advertisement for the school.

Parking issues - I know parking is an issue at the best of times and is part of our continual exhortations to council for a solution but can I remind parents that safety of our students is paramount? Double parking, driving onto school grounds and taking longer than needed in our 'kiss and drop' zone is unfair and creates larger issues for all parents following and are dangerous. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

Toilet upgrade - Over the Christmas period there will be upgrades to the boys and girl's toilets in A block (ground and top floor) and the toilet outside the Bottlebrush room. I am shortly to be briefed on what this will entail as it will possibly have an impact on the Gowrie holiday program. More details as they arise.

Band auditions - Thank you to Ms. Cecire and our band conductor Ryley for running the audition process for all our bands this week. This process is to assess if progression is warranted and for the training band to familiarise students with all the instruments of the band. Again, a reminder that training band in 2024 will move to the mornings for logistical reasons.

Remembrance Day assembly - congratulations to Melaleuca class students and Mr. Rodley for running the closest I have seen to a flawless assembly on Friday November 10. I guess I have created a little pressure now!

Swimming carnival - For those unfamiliar with the process for our school swimming carnival it is very early in the new year. Next year's carnival has been booked for February 9th so please make a note of it.

Car park pedestrian access – I am hopeful that we will be able to have a ramp on the Malcolm Street side of the school so prams, bikes and scooters can enter and exit safely. There are some issues regarding compliance from the department that need to be worked through before this can happen. Can I ask that families avoid walking through the double gate as the car park is hazardous by nature and with parking on the street, sometimes reduces visibility.

Earlier this year, Year 6 students participated in Write A Book In A Day, a writing competition for the purpose of raising money for the Kids' Cancer Project.










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Performing Arts Program



School Student Travel

Term 4 2023

2024 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a new or replacement School Opal card or travel pass for 2024 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement because of a new shared parental arrangement (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details <u>before</u> the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and travel passes remain valid for the start of the 2024 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2024.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Changes to your bus service provider

Within Greater Sydney, a number of bus service providers have changed their names.

Parents intending to lodge an application for a School Opal card will need to visit <u>transportnsw.info</u> <u>trip planner</u> to obtain the correct bus operator name servicing your area prior to lodging an application.

Travel from Term 12024

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for 2024 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2023, so parents/students can <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local</u> bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Students using School Opal cards are also reminded that they must tap on and tap off in line with the Student code of conduct and Opal terms of use.
