Principal's Message

Communication with school – Our department has introduced guidelines for 'switching off, for staff and community. Please read the advice contained in this newsletter. Please note that you will be responded to - usually within the next day between 8 a.m and 4 p.m. As you can imagine the school office staff receive a lot of correspondence.

Twilight sessions – Next Wednesday our staff will be completing the first of four twilight sessions over the year. These sessions are professional learning sessions to improve practice or knowledge in identified explicit areas. The focus of these sessions is Math, English and well-being for staff and students. This means at the end of the year staff will finish school on the same day as students.

Naplan – We have completed our naplan assessments for this year and the testing window has closed. Those students who needed to make up assessments have also now completed them. These results we hope will be released to the school at the start of next term. I am hopeful that we will be able to present our results, findings, trends etc. at the first P & C meeting of term 2.

AMU update – Just an update on various developments to some of our building issues. The roof repair is near completion on building C (Kindy classes and library). The hygienist has yet to send the results of post testing for mould in Building C, however I am hopeful that clearance will be given by terms end. We also had another commissioned inspection for the heritage building rooms, (stage 2 and stage 3 classes - Lemon Myrtle, Wollemi, Casuarina, Melaleuca, Boronia and the music room). We are also awaiting the hygienist report for that too, We have also identified floor work that needs to be done in 'break out' rooms (small rooms off main rooms) outside of Melaleuca and Wollemi. At the time of writing, the room outside Melaleuca has been repaired and we await repairs to the one outside Wollemi. I'd like to thank everyone for their patience whilst this extensive work has progressed as we have juggled classes, external providers, community users and band tutors. It has been a big ask of students, community, and staff but everyone has been understanding.

Carpark safety - Can I again remind people that we would rather students NOT use the carpark entrance as there is poor visibility and the environment can be very unstructured. On more than one occasion I have nearly opened the door of my car on students oblivious to the danger they are placing themselves in. I continue to press for a solution to access for our community with DoE assets department and the WHS directorate within Dept of Education.



Principal's Message

Extended Leave (school bytes) – We have now moved our Extended leave system online to school bytes. The process hopefully is now quicker and more convenient. It is a department requirement to apply for extended leave in advance, when your child will be away from school for 6 days or more.

For 5 days or less we'd like you to use the **Sentral app**. Sentral allow you to enter day to day non-attendance (sick leave or any other leave type of less than 5 days or less.)

Last week I was at a principal conference where there were several interesting guest speakers. One of the speakers that resonated with me regarded sleep. The one question that had me thinking was 'when something has to give, what is it you give up? My answer like lots of others I'd imagine was sleep. From this I learnt two things; you can't catch sleep up, the other was sleep was important for physical and cognitive repair. As such, included in this newsletter is tips to improve sleep that will in turn improve focus, productivity, and physical / mental well-being.

Practice at home

It goes without saying that without practice a child learning an instrument will stand still. In the first term practice is crucial as it's very easy to fall behind at the start of the year. Children have lots of activities during the week, but unlike a 1 hour soccer training or gymnastics session...the practice for band only needs to be 10-15 mins to start with. The amount of content they have covered doesn't require an hour of playing, and spending too long on it can induce boredom. As they learn and develop, that time spent practising will of course increase, and the child's tutor can keep you updated on how much they should be doing for the level they are at.

Lastly, it's really important that you are involved in your child's music development. You don't have to be musical at all, just sit with them occasionally when they're practising, ask them to show/play you some songs, get them to show you the new notes they learnt or what some of the musical terms mean. It helps create a sense that they're not just playing for themselves or the band, but that they're playing for you as well. Plus, showing you what they've just learnt is great for memory retention.
