






EAL/D NEWS

COMMUNITY IFTAR REPORT



Last Tuesday I had the pleasure of attending The Revesby Public School Community Iftar. This was the second Iftar and is now a very important event on the school's calendar.

The Iftar was a wonderful illustration of partnerships in this school community where students, parents, volunteers and teachers have once again organised a successful community event. The sentiments of togetherness and understanding were expressed in the address of Principal Narelle Nies, who highlighted the importance of the word "Together" meaning both to gather and to be in partnership.



An Iftar takes place at sunset during the 30 days of Ramadan in the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. This is the most blessed month of the year and is a time of reflection, prayer and renewal of faith all whilst achieving greater discipline, purification and compassion for those in the greater community. Between sunrise and sunset followers of Islam abstain from food and drink to complete one of the five pillars of Islam.

Sheikh Ahmed Abdo, emphasised that hosting an Iftar for the community was extremely important as an event that brings people together. "If you invite people to your house you're getting into the spirit of Ramadan, if you get invited to other people's houses you accept an invitation" Sheikh Abdo said. Revesby Public School is a family getting into the spirit of Ramadan and certainly taking on the importance

messages of this time.

There were many highlights of the night including parent Sheikh Ahmed Abdo beginning the official proceedings with a meaningful talk following the theme of the night about togetherness, compassion and how we are all one people. Former school captain Noah and current students Maha and Aaminah read from the Quran in both traditional Arabic and English translations and any students made traditional Kaaba and lanterns while guests viewed a film produced by the students about what Ramadan means to them.





As the sun set the beautifully decorated school hall with filled with families who broke the fast and shared a meal under the umbrella of cultural understanding and togetherness. While enjoying the meal, prepared by the Iftar Committee volunteers, families took time out from their busy lives to connect as a community.

The night was completed with the students, families and staff cutting a beautiful Ramadan Mubarak cake, such a significant way to demonstrate the partnerships of the community that is Revesby Public School.
