No Stopping Do not stop near a No Stopping sign.

No Parking

No waiting. You have
2 minutes to drop-off or
pick-up. You must stay
within 3 metres of your vehicle.

No Stopping

You must not stop on a length of road with a No Stopping sign. The first 10m

Stopping sign. The first 10m from an intersection is a no stopping zone. Yellow kerb lines are also No Stopping zones

Pedestrian Crossings

 In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle can stop on a pedestrian crossing.
 Do not let your child

in or out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing as this is a No Stopping zone.

Driveways & Footpaths

Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath.

PENALTES FROM \$330 -2 DEMEST POINTS

U turns

Illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across double white lines. PENALTIES \$ 330 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS

Double Parking

Double parking is illegal and is very dangerous in a school zone. S 330 + 2 DEMERIT PONTS
