


# "Whitney and Britney Chicken Detectives" by Lucinda Gifford


Whitney and Britney are marvellous chooks. Feathery singers, with stunning good looks.


### "Forces at the Amusement Park" by Tammy Enz.




### "The Forever Horse" by Stacy Gregg


As the two girls' stories emerge, tragedies unfold - both past and present - and Maisie realises that she can't begin to imagine life without her forever horse...
