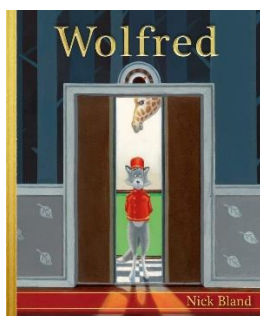


What's New at Our Library?



“Wolfred” by Nick Bland

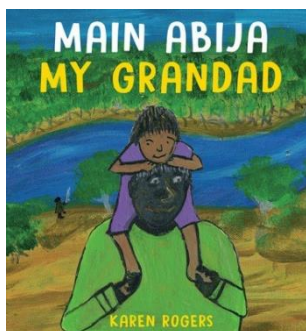
Fancy Pants Tower is the biggest, shiniest building in the city. And Wolfred operates the lift.

A tribute to a much-loved grandfather, celebrating First Nations Australian culture, country and the circle of life. Told in Kriol and English.

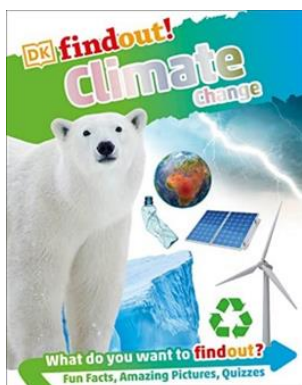
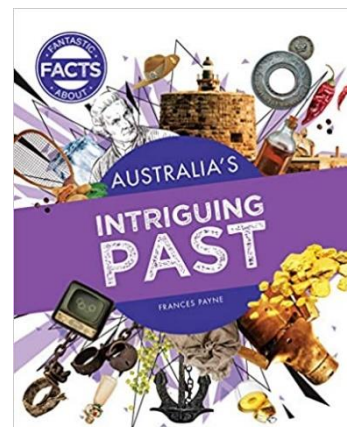

In 2019, kids around the world are going on strike for the future of the planet, and for their own futures. This book covers the facts about climate change so that your child can understand the challenge we're facing.

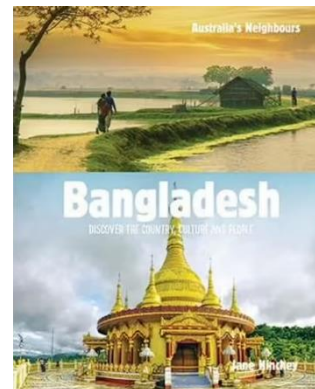

“Alice-Miranda in Egypt” by Jacqueline Harvey

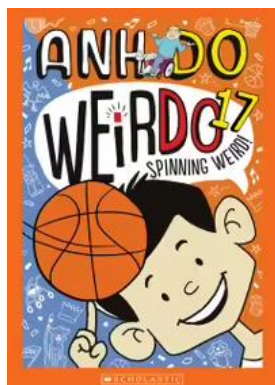
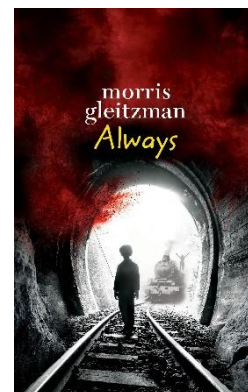
