WHAT IS STEM?

Students in year 8 are participating in a subject called STEM. What does this mean? STEM is an acronym for Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics.

These subjects, in combination with each other, develop necessary skills that are required for a 21st century workforce. That is collaboration, creativity, critical thinking and problem solving, flexibility, initiative as well as leadership skills.

The STEM subjects are integrated in an interdisciplinary approach where students gain knowledge and then apply this knowledge to situations. The project that students are gathering information about is called Ballistics. Students are gaining information on forces, angles, data collection, mathematical and computer modeling to produce a catapult that they will use to compete against each other in several challenges including distance, speed and accuracy.

At the end of the project (expected to be week 8 term 2) it is expected that students will participate in an interclass challenge and present their portfolios for all to view.

The venue is at Pop Up Venue located at 85 Market St Mudgee.


Voting can take place at the venue or online.
