FROM THE PRINCIPAL

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLANNING

The school plan is our map of how we are supporting learning over the next four years and aligning resources to achieve our priorities. This is currently in draft form, but is due to be uploaded and published on our website at the end of the term. There has been valuable feedback from staff, parents and students that has contributed to the key directions and the activities that will support learning and engagement at Kandos High School into the future. As always if anyone would like to view or provide feedback on the draft plan a copy is available at the front office, or an electronic copy can be requested.

Our three strategic directions for improvement across leading, learning and teaching are focused on:

- 1. Monitoring, analysing and providing differentiated instruction to ensure student growth and attainment;
- 2. Providing quality teaching and learning experiences for our students to reach their potential; and
- 3. Excellence in educational leadership and engaging with our learning community.

Activities within these areas are informed by research and evidencebased practise and we will continue to build on and enhance the work previously undertaken as we focus on learning and working in partnership with our parents and community. I will provide further snapshots of what the school planning teams are focusing on as the plan is implemented over the next four years.

TELL THEM FROM ME SURVEY

Mrs Fuller is currently organising a schedule for our students to complete this survey early next term, which asks them to provide feedback on a range of areas such as engagement, wellbeing, teaching practices in the school and the learning environment. Feedback from this survey is used by the school to improve any areas of concern that might be identified and to ensure we maintain the activities that students feel are a strength in supporting their learning and achievement. Information for parents and carers is available along with a non-consent form if you do not wish for your child to partake in the survey. This will need to be returned to roll call staff by week 10 to opt out. I highly recommend students participate to ensure we have a strong student perspective as part of our decision making.

FROM THE DEPUTY

ATTENDANCE IS IMPORTANT

Over the last few weeks I have been talking to students about the importance of attending school on a regular basis. Did you know that if a student takes just one day off each week, that is the equivalent of almost one term per year and over their six years of high school this equates to about one and a half years of missed opportunities to learn and grow?



ATTENDANCE MATTERS

When your child misses school they miss important opportunities to learn, build friendships, develop life skills and create good lifelong habits, Patterns of lateness have serious impacts on your child's education. Just 20 minutes a day equals twelve days per year. Our roll call / assembly / year meetings are 20 minutes long. They are an important way that we communicate with the students and yes at times there is learning done in them. Missing one 50-minute lesson per week means that your child is missing up to 30 days per year.

This is why it is important to try to make appointments for your child outside of school time whenever possible. This can be difficult at times and we understand that, so when your child is away from school, please encourage them to catch up on any work they have missed.



REASONS FOR ABSENCES

When your child is absent from school, there is a responsibility to report the reason for that absence as soon as the child returns. Whenever possible, parents and carers are encouraged to explain the absence before it occurs.

To explain an absence from Kandos High School, parents and carers may:

- Send a note or email the school
- Telephone or SMS the school, or
- Visit the school

Parents, guardians and carers can apply for a voucher with a value of up to \$100 per calendar year for each school-enrolled child and young person aged 4.5-18 years.

The voucher may be used with an approved Creative Kids provider for registration, participation and tuition costs for performing arts, visual arts, coding, languages, literature, music and other eligible creative and cultural activities.

Vouchers are valid from January until December each year.

All NSW school-enrolled children are eligible for **two \$100 Active Kids vouchers** each year. After 1 July, the second voucher can be claimed immediately after the first voucher.
