Although Term 1 commenced with operational measures to limit the spread of COVID, it is hard to believe that this year is possibly the first time in two years we are able to experience a somewhat normal school year, without lockdowns and remote learning. It is clear the pandemic has disrupted almost every element of our lives, the education of our children has been no exception, the importance of face-to-face learning is perhaps now more fully understood, and research is clearly indicating the negative impact remote learning has had on student mental wellbeing.

It was truly fantastic to see the school with all the new infrastructure in place that we have purchased or been allocated under the Department's Digital Strategy to improve the school space and our digital resources in the classrooms.

Walking the corridors, I was met with lots of visuals reminding students of what is on, who is on what team, the celebration of achievements, or examples of student work on display. The new display boards give the walls a modern feel and are visually appealing unlike the shabby predecessors. Colourful stair signage reminds us of our school values and motivational or thoughtful quotes as we walk to lessons. Cultural signage in areas reminds us we are on the land of Wiradjuri People and of our shared responsibility to respect and connect with culture and country.

It is refreshing to see the digital uplift within our learning spaces with upgrades to connectivity to the internet and classroom devices and interactive boards. The program aims to put regional schools on the same level as our metropolitan counterparts. The school is now using the cloud-based system Microsoft Teams for administration to support student management and learning. Further training in collaborative tools to be integrated into teaching and learning will happen across Term 3.

National Reconciliation Week is upon us running from 27 May to 3 June. A time for all Australians to learn more about our shared histories, cultures and achievements and to explore how we all play a part in achieving reconciliation. The theme for this year, "Be Brave. Make Change" is a challenge to individuals, families, communities, organisations and government - to Be Brave and tackle the unfinished business of reconciliation so we can Make Change that will benefit all Australians.

Courage or being brave is defined as the mental or moral strength to venture, persevere, and withstand danger, fear or difficulty. Our recent circumstances and challenges have revealed that we all embody this ability. What assumptions might we challenge, what brave actions might we complete in our daily lives of living, working, playing and socialising?


KHS OPENS BOYS & GIRLS TOUCH TEAMS
