Principals Message

Reconciliation Week

National Reconciliation Week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The Week runs from 27 May to 3 June every year. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey – the successful 1967 referendum and the High Court Mabo decision.

Reconciliation Australia's theme for 2023, "Be a voice for generations." For the work of generations past, and the benefit of generations future, let's act now to create a more just, equitable and reconciled country for all.

Reconciliation is a journey for all Australians – as individuals, families, communities, organisations and importantly as a nation. At the heart of this journey are relationships between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

This week all classes are creating an Acknowledgement to Country poster to pay respect to the Bediagal People of the Dharug nation, the land that we learn and play on at Tower Street PS. These posters will be displayed in classrooms.

We will also be completing a 'Sea of Hearts' in the front section of our school near the Tower Street entrance. All students have decorated a heart which will be placed on display. Community members are invited to decorate a heart and add it to the display, hearts will be available from the front office.

- Using strategies like "3 before me" in the classroom


Captain Tower is our PBL mascot and he is here to help parents / carers be involved with our PBL focus.
