PBL

Each fortnight we have a whole school PBL focus that we address and work on across the school. Classes complete lessons based on the PBL focus and practice the skills in the classroom, playground and at home. We include the fortnightly focus in each edition of Tower Talk so parents and carers can be included in the learning happening at school. Our whole school PBL focus for the fortnight is:

'We are safe and sensible during an emergency'.



Breathing tool - We stay calm and listen to teachers in an emergency

Caring tool - We care about the safety of ourselves and others

- Following teacher/adult instructions quickly and quietly
- Moving quickly but safely
- Staying quiet so that you can hear instructions easily
- Helping others stay calm

Captain Tower is our PBL mascot and he is here to help parents / carers be involved with our PBL focus.

Here are some questions you could ask your child to help them learn and practice our PBL focus this fortnight at home and school.

How can you stay safe during an emergency?

What should you do when you hear the smoke detector at home?

PBL Whole School Reward

Our Treasure Chest is full! That means we will be having a whole school reward very soon for all students who have remained out of Reflection Room or had one visit to Reflection Room. I know Miss Firth is busy organising an exciting whole school reward – I wonder what it will be?

External Validation

Once, during a four-year cycle, schools undergo an external validation of the evidence of their school self-assessment. This year, Tower Street PS has gone through the external validation process. This involves the school presenting sets of evidence aligned to Department of Education's framework, the school external validation team then engage in discussions with an external panel and have their self-assessments validated.

The panel, comprising of a Principal School Leadership (PSL) and a peer principal, meet with the school external validation team and determine whether the school's evidence supports their self-assessment. An external validation panel report, which includes the school-determined next steps in the self-assessment process, and school-determined future directions to support school improvement, is provided to the school following the external validation.

Our school held our external validation panel meeting on Thursday 1 June. Our school was deemed as 'Excelling' in areas of Learning Culture, Student Wellbeing & School Administrative Practice. This is an outstanding result for our school and reflects the exceptional work that happens each and every day at Tower Street PS. The panel was very complementary of the school evidence presented for validation and recognised the exceptional inclusive practices that were evident across our school.



Athletics Carnival Preparation

Our K-6 Annual Athletics Carnival is scheduled for Thursday 20 July and will be held at a new venue, Kelso North Reserve, Milperra. In preparation for this event all classes are practising their athletics skills at school.

We ask that students wear **sport shoes every day for the remainder of Term 2 with their regular school uniform.** This will ensure our students are able to participate in athletics activities. We appreciate your cooperation with this request.


Kindy 2024 enrolments

If you have a child starting school in 2024 now is the time to enrol! You can complete an online enrolment form through our school website or collect an enrolment pack from the school office.

K-3 Got It! Program

Getting on Track in Time - Got It! is an early intervention mental health and well-being program for children in Kindergarten to Year 3 and their parents and carers. The program helps parents and schools to identify children's social and emotional difficulties and supports them to respond to and reduce the severity and frequency of disruptive and difficult behaviours. It aims to intervene at a time when intervention is likely to be most effective in reducing the incidence of such behaviours and preventing the development of severe behaviour issues.

Got It! is a school-based program led and delivered by specialist NSW Infant Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (iCAMHS) professionals in partnership with school staff and the Department of Education. Got It! teams work collaboratively across two or three school terms with education staff, parents/carers and children to provide an evidence-informed approach to address problems early and get on track in time.



A targeted program is supported by a whole of school intervention and specialist assessment and referral for individual needs. Through providing local specialised mental health support, it also aims to improve a school's capacity to respond to children with behavioural, emotional and social difficulties in an ongoing way.

Tower Street PS is participating in the Got It! Program in Terms 3 & 4. In preparation for the program to begin all students in Years K-3 will bring home a parent/carer questionnaire to complete about their child's social emotional development. Mr Probert is coordinating this program across our school.

The Got It! team will be available today (13.6.23) at dismissal time near the Tower Street entrance. Come and meet the team, they are happy to answer any questions about the program.


Student Parliament News
