Presentation Day 2023

This year **Thursday 7th December is Tower Street's Presentation Day.** Our Presentation Day celebrations are split across two ceremonies.

The first ceremony at 10am is for the whole school. The students will walk into the hall formally at 10am. We ask that you are seated in the audience before this time. The awards presented at this assembly will be the class awards for Academic Excellence, Consistent Effort and Teacher's Choice Awards. The Library Awards, Art awards and David Coleman's Parliamentary awards will also be given out at this assembly as they are awarded to students from Kinder to Year 6.

The second assembly begins at 11:30am and is mostly for Years 3-6. The awards presented at this assembly will be Athletics, Swimming, PSSA, School Sport and of course Sportsperson of the year. Dance, Cultural, Citizenship, SRC, Dux, Kylie Wilkinson's Service Award, and the Principal's Award. The 2023 School Captains, Vice Captains and Prefects will receive their Medallions and our outgoing captains will give their final speeches at this assembly.

Our 2024 Student Leadership Team will be inducted, and the new captains will make their speeches at a special assembly next year. This assembly will take place on **Friday 9th February 2023 at 9:15** in our school hall.

School. Students in Years 3-6 will be expected to stay at school until the conclusion of the second presentation session.

Stage 3 Sexuality Education

Over the next three weeks, Year 5 & 6 students will be completing mandatory Sexuality Education lessons from the PDHPE curriculum. The content covered will include: body changes during puberty, feelings about growing and changing and the basic principles of human reproduction.

This would be a great time to have a conversation with your child about growing and changes associated with puberty. Your child may also have questions that cannot be covered during lessons.

Sexuality education in PDHPE K-6 factsheet

'Sexuality and sexual health' is one of the 14 contexts for learning embedded in the <u>Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) K-10 syllabus</u>. Sexuality education forms part of learning in the PDHPE key learning area in Years K-6. Sexual health content is addressed in Years 7-10.



What do students learn in K-6 sexuality education?

In NSW, we do not refer to this learning as 'sex education'. This term can send incorrect messages about the focus of student learning. Sexuality education content in K-6 is not about sex. Learning about sexual behaviour, including sexual intercourse, is explicitly addressed in Stages 4 and 5.

There are some common concepts addressed in both sexuality education and mandatory <u>child protection</u> education such as private body parts and consent. However, sexuality education should be explicitly taught as part of a whole-school PDHPE K-6 program.

NSW

In sexuality education students learn:

- in an age and developmentally appropriate way in each stage of learning
- the emotional, social and physical aspects of growing up, identity, gender, human sexuality and respectful relationships including consent
- correct names for parts of the body, basic principles of human reproduction, family and interpersonal relationships, and safety
- knowledge, skills, values and attitudes to have safe, fulfilling and enjoyable relationships
- to think critically and communicate effectively to make responsible and safe choices
- to recognise pressures from other people and be able to seek help from trusted adults and support networks.
