PBL – Whole School Focus:

Each fortnight we have a whole school PBL focus that we address and work on across the school. Classes complete lessons based on the PBL focus and practice the skills in the classroom, playground and at home. We include the fortnightly focus in each edition of Tower Talk so parents and carers can be included in the learning happening at school. Our whole school PBL focus for the fortnight is:



'We are upstanders'

Courage tool – We have the courage to do the right thing

Caring tool – We care about our school

- Reporting unsafe behaviour to the teacher
- Helping someone who is in trouble
- Helping someone else solve problems
- Telling someone that they're doing the wrong thing and that they should stop
- Including people who are sitting/playing alone

Captain Tower is our PBL mascot and he is here to help parents / carers be involved with our PBL focus.

Here are some questions you could ask your child to help them learn and practice our PBL focus this fortnight at home and school.

What could you do if you see something unsafe?

How did you include someone during recess/lunch today?

What does being an 'upstander' look like at school and outside of school?

PBL Awards

Each fortnight teachers present PBL wristbands to students who have demonstrated safe, respectful or learner behaviour. The wristband recipients are recognised during school assemblies and share how they earned the PBL wristband. Congratulations to our PBL wristband recipients who took home a wrist band on Friday.

Treasure tokens align directly with the fortnightly PBL focus. Teachers give out treasure tokens when they see students following the PBL focus. This fortnight teachers will be on the look out for students who are upstanders in the classroom or in the playground. Each classroom has a container to collect treasure tokens. Each fortnight a treasure token is drawn from the class container for a reward. The more treasure tokens a student collects the more chance they have of winning a special iceblock! More importantly each classes treasure token collection is placed in our school treasure token chest. When the school chest is full it is time for a whole school PBL reward!

Class Dojo

Tower Street PS Class Dojo - Rules of Engagement

Class Dojo is a communication tool that we will be using to share updates about what is happening in your child's classroom. We are hoping this communication channel will provide an insight into your child's learning journey and assist parents/carers to feel connected to what is happening at school.

The following rules of engagement are explicit and mandatory rules about the acceptable behaviour for all participants. In joining our community on Class Dojo, you are agreeing to follow the Department of Education Code of Conduct and School Community Charter. We reserve the right to remove comments or participants that do not adhere to the rules of engagement as outlined below:

Staff Commitments:

- Will establish a Class Dojo account for their current class
- Will send Parent/Carer invitations to join their child's Class Dojo Account
- Will post a minimum of 1 'Class Story' per week (during the school term)
- Will respond to Parent/Carers messages, questions or enquiries with 48 hours (on school days during the school term only where possible)
- Monitor activity on the Class Dojo account between 8.30-4pm (on school days during the school term)
- Will ensure only photos of students with 'Permission to Publish' are used in Class Dojo 'Class Story' posts.
- Will follow the DoE Code of Conduct at all times
- Will abide by the DoE 'School Community Charter' at all times

Parent / Carer Commitments:

- Enjoy having an insight into their child's classroom and be a part of their child's learning journey.
- View the photos and posts from Class Dojo with their child and use this to discuss the achievement of their child.
- Be respectful in all comments and interactions through Class Dojo
- Understand that teachers are unable to provide an instant response to messages, questions
 or enquiries through Class Dojo. All urgent communication should continue to be directed
 to the School Office.
- Use the messaging function of 'Class Dojo' responsibly being mindful of excessive messaging.
- Do not share, save or screenshot images of other children from Class Dojo to other Social Media channels
- Understand that when class teachers are sick or on leave Class Dojo will not be active.

School Principal Commitments:

- Monitor the use of Class Dojo across the school ensuring all participants are following the DoE 'School Community Charter'
- Ensure all users are following our school Class Dojo 'Rules of Engagement'
- Revoking access to any user not abiding by the 'School Community Charter' or 'Rules of Engagement'
- Has the right to alter or amend our school Class Dojo 'Rules of Engagement' at any time and communicate changes to the school community.


Term 1 Book Fair 2023

If you are unable to come at this time, students will be given the opportunity to visit the Book Fair in the morning and we will help them choose a suitable book, just put some money in an envelope. Most books are priced between \$10-\$20.

Tower Street Public School students love reading! The Book Fair is an exciting event that engages children and promotes literacy. There will be books to suit every reading level and interest and it's a fun opportunity for children to see, touch and connect with books they want to read. Every book sold at the Book Fair helps to earn free books for our school.

We will be doing our book character parade later in the year, in Term 3. Students do not dress up in book character costumes on this day.





Mobile Phones & Smart Watches at school

Students do not need access to these devices during the school day. At the conclusion of the school day these devices are collected by students from the school office. School Swimming & Water Safety Program

This term our students have the opportunity to participate in the School Swimming & Water Safety Program. This is a learn to swim and water safety program for primary schools students. This program provides free swimming lessons each day for two weeks. Our school will take part from Monday 20 March to Friday 31 March.

We are expecting all Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4 students to participate in the program this year. Normal classroom activities during the morning will not operate for Year 2, 3 & 4 during this period.

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Parkrun is positive, welcoming and inclusive, there is no time limit and no one finishes last. Everyone is welcome to come along. parkrun is free and you only need to register once whether walking, jogging, running, volunteering or a combination. There are currently 464 parkrun events around the country taking place every weekend, with more locations being added all of the time. You can go along to any event, any weekend.

Parkrun is free and you only need to register once, regardless of how many different events you visit and whether you intend to walk, jog, run, volunteer or do a combination.
