The School has recently heavily invested in new readers for our K-2 students to provide additional

home readers. This will create a larger bank of books for the students to borrow and read at the appropriate level.

Teacher Professional Learning

Our staff over the past four years have undertaken many hours of professional learning. This has place taken both class/school time and during the teachers' own time. It is a mandatory component for all teachers and has resulted in excellent teaching practices and student learning outcomes. In several teachers 2018 Kindergarten – Year 2 will be engaged in training for the L3 program. Our whole school will participate in a focus on writing lead by Mrs Ferlazzo. Every school has been provided with funding to release staff under the Quality Teaching, Successful Students (QTSS) program. To facilitate this program Mrs Woolley will be sharing the teaching role of 1/2F.

New Class for Penshurst West PS

The School has been selected to establish a new Special Needs class for Autism. The class will commence later this term with several new students to our school. This is great recognition for the school and community. Over the coming weeks the school will make adjustments which include the closing of the front gates. New fencing and gates will be installed to make the entry a safer area for all and will enhance the safety of the students at after school care.

Swimming Carnival

Our Annual Swimming Carnival is coming up on Wednesday 21st February. Students in Year3-6 are expected to attend. Races will be held for all ages from 8yr -12/13.

Any Year 2 student turning 8 years old in 2018 and who is able to competently swim 50 metres may also attend the swimming carnival.

Student Welfare Officer

Toward the end of last year the school applied for a program known as the chaplaincy program. A grant of \$7000 from the NSW Government matched by the school and community allows for this program to run in schools. It is not a religious program but a social welfare/wellbeing program to run for 3 years.

While the key tasks of a student wellbeing support officer will vary depending on the needs of individual school communities, they could include:

- Working closely with, and/or as part of the school learning and support team or wellbeing committee and to enhance student resilience and wellbeing services.
- Supporting the social and emotional wellbeing of students
- Developing relationships with, and referring students to specialist services within the school or externally, under the supervision of the school principal.
- Attending Parents & Citizens' or equivalent parent body meetings as required to provide details of the program and the services that are available.
- Facilitating community partnership programs between the school and the wider community, under the supervision of the school principal.

Maintenance

In the coming weeks the school is going to receive a considerable facelift as workmen commence painting tasks around the school both inside and outside. We look forward to a fresher learning environment.

P&C Meetings
