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Science Trophy

During National Science Week in August this year, Ulladulla High School entered the statewide inaugural Science Quake of the Year competition held by Geoscience Australia. Year 10 Marine hits the Big Smoke

Year 10 Marine Studies students went on a 2 day excursion up to Sydney. They went to the Sealife Aquarium at Darling Harbour where they got to see fish from all over Australia, from prehistoric lungfish, many species of sharks, colourful tropical species, a dugong and the very cute arctic penguins. A special ferry trip over to Manly saw us drive by some amazing naval ships lined with sailors that we later discovered were saluting the King and Queen who were in a boat nearby. The next day was an early start to go to the Sydney Fish Markets where we had a behind the scenes tour seeing all the amazing seafood that gets auctioned every day. Learning about how they grade the sashimi levels of the tuna. We ended day 2 with a trip to the Australian Maritime Museum where we learned about the Seabin initiative helping stop plastic pollution in Sydney Harbour. We got to drive underwater drones to explore further into Sydney Harbours depths. Students also got to explore the Submarine HMAS Onslow and the last of this country's big gun ships HMAS Vampire. This was a real highlight seeing how these seamen live and work in such cramped quarters.



Safer Drivers for Year 11 Students

Over the past 2 weeks, Year 11 students have been participating in the Milton-Ulladulla Driver Education program. The main aim of this program is to make students aware of the consequences of their actions or inactions and instil a safe attitude when driving on the road. Day 1 involved a presentation at school by local Senior Police Constables, Jason Mudge and Lachlan Cooper, on topics such as the police role in reducing road trauma, the hazards, statistics, and the effect of speed, fatigue, alcohol and drugs. Some of the videos were very confronting, which made students realise the impact their decisions can potentially have on themselves and others when they get behind the wheel. It also provided an opportunity to ask the police questions related to driving, which stimulated some lively discussions! Day 2 was held at the West Ulladulla Sporting Complex and involved groups of students rotating around a variety of presenters. These included practical demonstrations by driving instructors, mechanics, Ambulance, Fire & Rescue, SES and highway patrol officers. Students learned what to do if they attended an accident scene and how to change a wheel with a flat tyre. They tried on and used rescue equipment, watched the "jaws of life" in action in a car extraction, and much more. Rotary cooked up a great BBQ lunch for everyone, which was much appreciated! Students travelled by bus to a racetrack (Wakefield Park or Pheasant Wood Circuit in Marulan) on Day 3. They received lectures and participated in practical demonstrations, such as parking, Random Breath testing, and probably everyone's favourite, experiencing how the Anti-lock Braking System works at different speeds. The smell of burned rubber lasted for hours! We thank the enthusiastic



instructors, the Emergency Services, Milton-Ulladulla Rotary, sponsors, teachers and community members who have volunteered their time and expertise to run such a worthwhile program and ensure the future safety of young drivers on our roads.

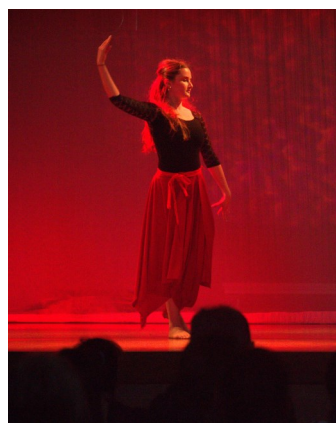

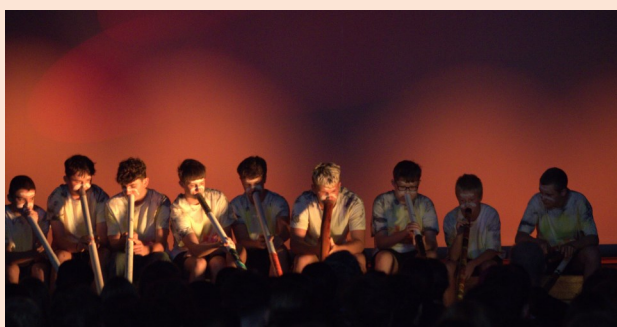

At our recent NAIDOC Assembly, we proudly recognized outstanding contributions with five NAIDOC Awards. 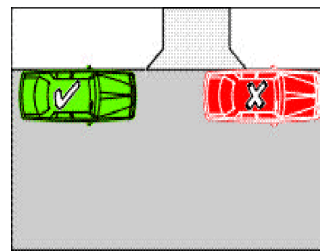
