Thank You to St John NSW for Defibrillator Donation

We are incredibly grateful to St John NSW and the Sitaramayya family for their generous donation of a defibrillator and casing, along with a commemorative plaque to our school. Andrew Sitaramayya was a dedicated St John Ambulance member who left a corporate role to give back to the



community. He died from a sudden cardiac arrest in 2022 and in his memory, Andrew's wife raised \$24,000 to supply the St John Ambulance defibrillators to the community. This vital piece of equipment has been installed in the Q block staff foyer area, ensuring it is accessible and centrally located near the oval, basketball areas, and staff room. This addition significantly enhances the safety and well-being of our students, staff, and visitors. We already have a defibrillator in the admin sickbay room, and this new installation further strengthens our emergency preparedness. We would also like to extend our thanks to Cecelia Haddad, Communications Adviser, for coordinating this initiative. On Thursday 26 September a CPR and Defibrillator awareness training session was held for a selection of students and staff, facilitated by a member of St John NSW, and covered by local media. Thank you once again to St John NSW for their continued support and commitment to our school's health and safety.
