Kokoda Youth Challenge

On Friday 11 October, 8 students, 3 parents, Year 11 Adviser Mrs Smith and Miss Dunnett, drove up to Lake Macquarie to participate in the annual Kokoda Youth Challenge. After some serious carb-loading at dinner and a nervous sleep, we were up before dawn, loading up the cars and heading off to Cooranbong for a 7:30am start. Thankfully, it was a cool day. It was an extremely challenging (and steep) course through the Olney State Forest; along 4WD tracks, bush trails, and the odd



bitumen road, scrambling over rocks, dodging huge mud puddles (not always successfully!) and just trying to stay upright when walking downhill Miss Dunnett said that running a marathon was easier! (Not so sure about that one). Some stats for you: Distance: 48 km, Elevation gain: 1282m, Equivalent number of stairs climbed: 422, Time: 12 hours 48 minutes. The students involved were: Eleisha Anderson, Amv Bruce, Elsie Foster, Owen Goodwin, Alex Gunn, Chloe Jeffers, Kira Inkova and Jordan Magi. They displayed strength, endurance and resilience, supporting and encouraging each other when the Kokoda Challenge began taking a toll, physically and mentally. Not everyone was able to complete the course, due to health issues and injuries. However, I am so impressed how these students put their hands up for the challenge, tackled it head-on and really pushed themselves to their limits. They should be very proud of their efforts. It would not have been possible without our wonderful support crew who drove us there, fed us, strapped ankles, tended to blisters and cheered us on. Thank you so much! We raised \$2300 in donations for the Kokoda Youth Foundation. Every dollar raised goes towards running free youth programs that mentor local kids in the community to reach their full potential. Kioloa


