Ulladulla High School honoured the ANZAC spirit with a moving ceremony in week 11, led with dignity by School Captain Jordan Magi and School Leader Elsie Foster. The school community came together in a powerful tribute that combined tradition, creativity, and cultural recognition, making it a standout event in the local commemorative calendar. The ceremony featured a series of unforgettable performances that reflected the ongoing significance of ANZAC Day.
