



Our Merit System

We want all students to understand our UHS Merit Recognition Scheme, which celebrates and encourages students to develop their agency through the dispositions of learning. Using the Interpersonal, Intrapersonal, and Cognitive Learning lenses of the

Disposition Wheel, students identify and apply these dispositions to enhance their self-regulation and goal achievement. The Merit Scheme supports both short-term and long-term goals, recognising daily efforts and higher achievements. Teachers focus on areas like Curiosity, Focus, and Grit, awarding merits on Sentral, visible on the Parent/Student Portal. These accumulate for higher-level awards, helping students connect with what it means to be a well-rounded learner and recognise their agency in their success.





Onstage - Sydney

Last week, the HSC Drama students were given the opportunity to attend "ONstage" - a showcase of the top Drama performances and submitted works from 2024 as Curated by the Arts Unit, NSW Department of Education.
