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Youth Roadmap: Young People Shaping Ulladulla's **Future**

Over the past few weeks, students from Ulladulla High have taken part in the first two sessions of the Youth Roadmap a Dunn Lewis initiative designed to amplify young voices and codesign a community that reflects their needs, ideas, and



passions. Through fun, interactive workshops, students have explored what makes them feel connected - or disconnected - from their community. Many shared a desire for safe spaces to hang out, more youth-friendly activities, and stronger connections with local support networks. Already, some of the core ideas emerging include better transport options, improved sports fields and footpaths, and more recreational activities that help young people feel engaged and included. These workshops are just the beginning. Next, a group of students that want to make change, will take part in a two-day workshop to develop their

ideas into actionable, pitchready projects. These projects will then be presented to local community leaders, funding bodies, and support organisations that are ready to support voung people in bringing their ideas to life. We're incredibly proud of


