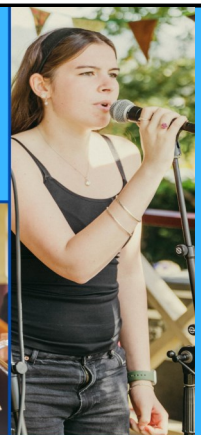


DV Awareness Cup

On June 19, Ulladulla High proudly took part in the Under 16's DV Awareness Cup at Bomaderry Sporting Complex. The event, organised by the South Coast Police District with support from the NRL, Group 7 Rugby League, and St George Illawarra Dragons, united six Shoalhaven high schools in a day of sport and a Stakeholders Workshop promoting education and awareness around Domestic and Family Violence. The Ulladulla girls' league tag team came out strong with a 12-4 win over Vincentia. After a close 6-12 loss to St John's, they bounced back to beat Bomaderry 6-4. Despite narrowly missing the finals, they showcased great determination and school spirit. The boys' team began with an 18-6 loss to St John's but turned things around with a 24-4 win over Vincentia and a 16-6 victory over Shoalhaven High, earning a finals berth by just six points. In a thrilling final against St John's, Ulladulla trailed 4-0 until Thomas Rosen-Wain scored off a high kick in the final seconds. Cameron Campbell nailed the sideline conversion, securing a 6-4 win and the 2025 DV Awareness Cup. Off the field, Ulladulla students were also honoured with the Southern Women's Group DV Awareness Cup - *Champions of Knowledge and Respect* - for their outstanding engagement during the workshops. Thanks to the South Coast Police District, NRL, Group 7 Rugby League, and all community partners. Congratulations to all players and special thanks to staff Matthew Berry, Sharon Bunyan, Toni Williams, and Riley Wooden. Shout-out to alumni Keele Browne and Hannah Southwell for inspiring our students.

About the NCCD – Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

All Australian schools are required to participate in the NCCD on an annual basis. The NCCD is an annual data collection that requires information on the extent of support and adjustments made for students with disability. The data collection supports a broader model of engagement and support for these students that draws on teachers' professional judgement and practices throughout the year to support students with disability to access and participate in education on the same basis as other students. Implementation of the model enables schools to fulfil their mandatory obligations to students under the national Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (DDA) and Disability Standards for Education 2005. Understanding these legal obligations and the mechanisms for collecting and using NCCD data is essential knowledge for principals and teachers. School principals are responsible for verifying the accuracy of their school's data and validating that there is evidence at the school to support the inclusion of a student in the data collection. Evidence must be retained for a minimum of 7 years. NCCD data is used to inform funding provided by the Australian Government to NSW and may be the subject of audits or compliance activities.
