External Validation

On Thursday 27 June, our school participated in External Validation. External Validation happens in schools every four years, it is a lengthy process that involves the school submitting evidence to support our judgments in relation to 14 different statements of excellence. There are four levels of validation in each of the 14 areas. I am pleased to announce that our school has been identified as Excelling in 4 of the 14 areas. This is a huge achievement, many schools do not achieve excelling in any areas. Of the remaining 10 areas, 8 are sustaining and growing and 2 are delivering.



The external validation panel included the following comments in their final report... *Dear Belinda*.

I just wanted to email and say what an absolute pleasure and privilege it was to visit Werrington County Public School yesterday, (albeit virtually!) to undertake the External Validation Panel Meeting with you all. As discussed, the Peer Principal, Mel and I thought the submission was aligned to the elements and themes of the School Excellence Framework, containing some quality artefacts and annotations.

Mel and I were pleased to be able to unpack a little more of what had been provided in the submission by having a professional, collegial conversation that brought to life the information on the pages of the Evidence Sets. It was a pleasure speaking with your team and I ask that you pass on my congratulations to them all.

It was really great to hear each of the team members talk about the submission, the everyday practices of the school and the genuine passion for public education they have, and more importantly the passion they have for their school.

As discussed, undergoing this process with authenticity and a structured process has enabled the capacity building of all staff and enhanced the knowledge of the school community in its entirety about the SIP, the School Excellence Framework and the 'why' of all decision making at the school; congrats to you all!

Real Schools Professional Learning

As we move to the 6-month mark in our partnership with Real Schools, Mrs Willis and I attended a professional Learning Day on Friday 28 June to further our knowledge to support the amazing work that we are doing to support student wellbeing at our school.





We would also like to thank our wonderful umpires Kym, Rylee, Myer, Lily and Ella!






BASKETBALL KNOCKOUT


Werrington County Public School competed against Samuel Gilbert Public School in the second round of the basketball knockout competition.

Despite the loss, our team played exceptionally well, showcasing great skills and even scoring a three-point shot.


The game was held at the Penrith Valley Regional Sports Centre, adding to the special memories created.











Spirals Of Inquiry Update

During our Professional Learning in Spirals of Inquiry our teachers have been deeply examining what is going on for our Werrington County Learners in Mathematics.

We have been completing professional readings and looking at our data to decide where we need to go next to improve mathematical learning at our school.

At the end of Term 2 all our Stage Teams developed a "hunch" about what we could be doing to have a positive impact on student learning in Mathematics.

In Term 3 our teachers will be looking at the evidence, staying curious and testing ways to improve student learning.

Each stage team will be focusing on the following:

<u>Early Stage 1 and Stage 1:</u> Developing "real world" connections for students to make mathematical learning more relevant and purposeful.

<u>Stage 2:</u> Developing student confidence in mathematics though providing a variety of concrete materials to support student learning.

<u>Stage 3:</u> Implementing the daily mentals program "Numeracy Ninja" to build mathematical confidence and improve our student's ability to retain basic number facts and then implement these when working on more complex mathematical problems.

<u>Special Education:</u> Building our student's resilience and the ability to risk take and develop a growth mindset during Mathematics lessons.

<u>Specialist Team</u>: Deepening our student's understanding of the relevance of what they are learning, to improve the quality of student work across all Key Learning Areas.
