These pictures show how students work together to develop their ability to recall multiplication facts instantly and apply their knowledge to the game.








In English, students learn to write from a perspective and use words that persuade and influence the reader. They have been learning about Ned Kelly, the life he led, and what forced him into a life of crime.


In Maths, we've been learning about fractions and decimals.





2024 PSSA Zone Athletics Carnival

Werrington County PS had a magnificent day at the PSSA Zone Athletics Carnival, held at Harold Corr Oval on Thursday, August 22nd, 2024. Thirty-four students represented the school in track and field events, achieving outstanding results—a massive shout out to all the amazing parents who helped on the day. The day would have been much more challenging to navigate without their support.

Some of the highlights of the day were Joshua placing 1st in the 8-year-old boys 100m dash, Charlotte placing 3rd in the 9-year-old girls 100m dash, Nate placing 1st in senior boys high jump, Braxton 3rd in senior boys discus, Alyra 2nd in senior girls discus, Jaxon 3rd in junior boys discus, Tannan Hallam 3rd in junior boys high jump, Archie 1st in 11 years boys high jump, and the senior girls relay coming 2nd by 200th of a second. There were many personal best broken on the day, boosting individuals' confidence.

Chelsea finished the day with a record in the 200m dash, 2^{nd} in the senior girls' high jump, 1^{st} in discus, 1^{st} in the 100m dash with a time of 13.30, 1^{st} in the long jump, and 2^{nd} in the senior girls' relay. Chelsea was also recognised as the senior girl's champion.

What needs to be acknowledged is the compassion students displayed towards one another in celebrating everyone's achievements on the day and their outstanding behaviour.

Spirals Of Inquiry Update

During our Spirals Sessions, our teachers have been looking at ways to make our Mathematics teaching more explicit.

Explicit Teaching is one of eight quality teaching practices. It happens every day in all our classrooms and is a powerful, evidence-based teaching practice.

Explicit teaching practices involve teachers clearly showing students what to do and how to do it, rather than having students discover that information themselves. Students who experience explicit teaching practices make greater learning gains than students who do not experience these practices.

Our teachers have been examining how they are using explicit teaching during Mathematics lessons and have linked their focus work in spirals to a specific explicit teaching strategy.



2 key focus points so far have been Connecting Learning to make it relevant, and Gradual Release of Responsibility, building confidence and independence in Mathematics.




