Semester 1 Reports

Teachers have finished writing the Semester 1 Reports. The reports are currently in the proof reading and editing phase of our process. Semester 1 Reports will go home on the date advertised in the Newsletter on Wednesday 3 July 2024 (Week 10).

Staffing

Just as we ask unwell students to stay home from school, we also ask any staff who are unwell to stay home. This is to try and stop the spread of colds, flu and COVID-19. As we move into winter, just like our students teachers and support staff are also more likely to become unwell with colds and flu. Many of our staff recently received their Flu Vaccine to try and reduce the impact of illness across winter.

When teachers are absent, we do our best to access casual teachers to cover the class for the day. However, there are times when we are unable to secure a casual teacher to cover the class. In these circumstances we have a number of options available to us: 1. We can temporarily suspend support programs so that our support teachers can cover classes. 2. We can 'split' the class. This involves a class being split into small groups (approx. 2-4 students per group). Each group is then sent with work to another class in the school for the day. Our first priority is always to secure a casual teacher to cover the class for the day. The winter months are traditionally difficult to secure casual teachers due to the increase in illness, we are noticing that this is already starting to occur.

Supervision - Before and After School

I would like to take this opportunity to remind our families that supervision of students does not commence until 8.30am. Our front gates are closed and are not opened until 8.30am, students waiting outside the gate prior to 8.30am are unsupervised.

If you are running late and are unable to collect your child at 3pm, please contact the office to let us know. Teachers attend meetings most afternoons during the week and are unable to provide supervision for students after 3pm.

We encourage families to contact our Out of School Hours Care provider in the school hall if you require care before or after school.

Parking at drop off and pick up times

I would like to remind families that we have a few no stopping zones outside the school, these areas are clearly marked by signage. We have had the rangers out a couple of times this year and they have booked parents who are parked illegally during drop off and pickup times.

Please also be mindful when dropping off and picking up from OOSH, that these no stopping zones still apply outside school hours.

Thank you to those families who are parking in the correct places, keeping our students safe.


