Affective Statements

Warami (Hello),

This term our teachers have been working on increasing the number of Affective Statements we use each day.

Affective statements convey personal emotions, both positive and negative, to express how a child's behaviour affects the other child's feelings. We use them to develop empathy and to build an understanding of how their actions influence other people.

Affective Statements can be used at home, school or anywhere really. Our teachers have been focused on using positive affective statements to set our students up for success by telling them how we will feel if the students are following our instructions. We have been using this feelings wheel to help expand our vocabulary of feelings words. You might like to try it at home, I have included more information on the next page.

A

ffective statements express personal feelings, both negative and positive, to communicate how a child's behaviour makes them feel.

How do I create them?

You simply throw in a feelings word to a comment or request you normally use. For example, "Put your towel on the rack" becomes "It upsets me that you leave your towel on the floor, can you please hang it up". And a positive example "I am really pleased that you hung up your towel."

Why do we use them?

We use them to develop empathy and to build an understanding of how their actions influence other people. In time children will think about their actions and adjust their behaviour.

They represent personal expressions of feeling in response to specific positive or negative behaviours of others.

What does it look like at home and school?

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Supervision - Before and After School

I would like to remind families that we have a few no stopping zones outside the school, these areas are clearly marked by signage. We have had the rangers out a couple of times this year and they have booked parents who are parked illegally during drop off and pickup times

Please also be mindful when dropping off and picking up from OOSH, that these no stopping zones still apply outside school hours.




'You can see stars at night, you can't see them in the day. I used to think the stars go away in the day but they don't. You just can't see them because the sun is too bright.' Mia

learning about space this term through the book 'Deadly Science: The Solar System'. As well as learning about the planets in our galactic neighbourhood, we've learnt about the features of informative texts, such as subheadings and diagrams. We've also created some fun space themed artworks!



In 34B we have been investigating the Solar System during our English lessons. We have been learning to take notes, write informative paragraphs and putting it all together to form information reports. Here is what a few students have written.

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The Earth by Wanda 34B

Earth is the ideal planet for us. It is the third planet from the Sun and has around 7 billion plants, people and animals. Earth is also known as the blue planet because how much water there is.

Earth is mostly blue, but it has some green and brown from the countries, when Earth faces the Sun, it is summer, when facing away it is winter and colder. There is also spring and autumn which are the seasons in between when it is not so cold or hot.


