#### Walk Safely to School Day 2023

On Friday 19 May, we celebrated 'Walk Safely to School Day', this initiative encouraged all students to walk safely to school to promote an active lifestyle. It was fantastic to greet so many smiling faces at the school gates celebrating a healthy, active lifestyle within our Rosehill community. The department of education encourages safe, active travel and aims to promote positive attitudes towards health and safety by providing opportunities such as Walk Safely to School Day to talk about being a safe road user. Walking to school eases traffic congestion, parking difficulty and promotes physical activity.

Parents/Carers, please take note of the tips below and discuss these with your child/children:

- \*give your child lots of supervised practice in the traffic environment.
- \*teach your child about being alert in a road environment.

- \*always hold your child's hand up to the age of at least 8 years old, when on the footpath, crossing the road or in a carpark. Until they are at least 10 years of age, children should be closely supervised by an adult and hold hands when crossing the road.
- \*explain why the place you have chosen is the safest place to cross the road.
- \*point out dangers, such as vehicles coming out of driveways.
- \*use pedestrian crossings and traffic lights correctly.
- \*teach your child to keep turning their head in both directions to look and listen for traffic as they cross the road.
- \*explain why they should look and listen before crossing a driveway, road or carpark.
- \*reinforce Stop! Look! Listen! Think! every time you cross the road together.

STOP! one step back from the kerb.

LOOK! continuously look both ways.

LISTEN! for the sounds of approaching traffic.

THINK! whether it is safe to cross.

\*observe if older children are ready to cross the road independently.






