School Uniform

Please send your children to school each day in full school uniform. If there is ever the need for your child not to be in full school uniform, please send in a note to your child's teacher with your child explaining the situation. Include why this is the case and for how long it will happen for. Thank you in advance for your assistance with this manner.

School Times

Before School

Staff members are rostered on duty from 8:25am. Before this time there is no formal supervision. Students should not arrive at school before that time. School starts at 8.55am, please ensure your child arrives on time.

After School

Please ensure that students are collected promptly at the end of the school day.

Covid-19

Currently NSW is experiencing increased numbers of COVID-19 infections.

COVID-19 PCR testing in NSW changed on 13 May. For most people, if you have COVID-19 symptoms, please do a <u>rapid antigen test</u> (RAT). RATs are available for free at Service NSW service centres, mobile service centres and recovery centres. <u>Find a RAT near you</u>.

If you are at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19, contact your doctor for testing advice.

If you can't contact your doctor, call healthdirect on 1800 022 222 or use the online <u>Service Finder</u> to find a GP near you.

If your doctor recommends a COVID-19 PCR test, they will give you a pathology referral form for a free COVID-19 PCR test.

The referral form will have a private pathology provider location to visit so you can get tested.

Steps to reduce your COVID risk

To protect yourself and your loved ones:

1. Stay up to date with recommended COVID-19 vaccinations.

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- 2. Stay home if you have cold or flu symptoms and get tested.
- 3. Wear a mask in crowded, indoor places.
- 4. Talk with your doctor now if you are at higher risk of severe illness. You may be eligible for antiviral medicines.
- 5. Don't visit people who are at higher risk if you have symptoms or COVID-19.

Sick Students

Please keep children at home if they are unwell. This will minimise students spreading illnesses through classes and allow students to rest and recuperate.

Road Safety Tips

Top tips From the NSW Government Website – Education Here to help our students make a safe trip to and from school.

1. Be alert and aware

Take note of the dangers you come across on your walk and bring them to your child's attention. Point out dangers, such as vehicles coming out of driveways. Talk to your child about being alert in a road environment.

2. Hold hands

When on the footpath, at a crossing or in a car park always hold your child's hand. It is advised to do this up to the age of at least 8 years old and closely supervise until at least the age of 10.

3. Choose a safe crossing

Lead by example and choose a safe place to cross the road. Explain why it is the safest place to cross.

4. Set a good example

Your child watches everything you do, so if you cross at the crossing they will too. It is also important to share these messages with other carers who may walk with your child to school.

5. Stop, Look, Listen, Think every time you cross the road

Discuss this important road safety message. STOP! one step back from the kerb. LOOK! continuously both ways. LISTEN! for the sounds of approaching traffic. THINK! whether it is safe to cross and keep checking until safely across Practise makes perfect.

The more supervised practice your child can get the better, so why not make Term 1 the start of a new routine to walk with your child to school more often.

Messages to share with your children in Kindergarten to Year 2

Hold a grown up's hand when:

- you cross the road
- you're on the footpath



- you're in a car park

Messages to share with children in Years 3 to 6

-Use a safe place to cross the road

-Stop! Look! Listen! Think! every time you cross the road and keep checking until safely across

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Internet Safety Tips for Parents & Carers

- Children Under 13 ARE NOT ALLOWED on Facebook, Instagram, Kik, SnapChat, iTunes, Discord, TikTok, What's app and many more. Don't support your child to break the rules & they won't be the only one without these accounts. Learn to say NO!

- ABSOLUTELY NO EXCHANGE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION!
- Very close supervision for young children is recommended. There should be a limit to the email correspondence/msn to be a list of friends and family that has been approved.
- Whatever your children use, you must use as well. Set up accounts on the same sites to ensure that they are suitable and the interactions appropriate. Engage with them online. This also allows you to know how these applications work.
- If your child is playing online games, it is YOUR responsibility to make sure that YOU know how to play the game too in case of problems. Play online games together.
- Do not let young children 'google' aimlessly with no supervision. Children need to be taught about search engines and how they work.
- The use of computers, laptops or any internet enabled devices (iPad, phone, iPod, Xbox) SHOULD be in a common area of the house NOT IN THE BEDROOM! Need an alarm buy a clock radio!
- Parental monitoring is vital walk past and see what your child is doing, who they are talking to and what sites they are on....be aware if their mood changes. This is NOT invading their privacy at all...it is parenting in the digital space.


