Celebrating Attendance

WHSPA, in which we will regularly celebrate excellent and improved attendance as part of our school plan.

Punctuality

Reminder – Punctuality to Roll Call each morning is vital. The expectation is that students are at school ready to attend Roll Call at 8.50am. When a student arrives after 8.50am the process is disrupted, and the flow on effects are very demanding on staff.

Roll Call is also our main method of communicating upcoming events, meetings, and general announcements to students. If your child is not present they are likely to miss out on important information. Students who are late need to have a note to explain why. If not, the absence will be recorded as an 'unexplained partial absence'.

Attendance - Arriving late, and leaving early

A reminder that students are not permitted to leave the school grounds during the day, unless they are approved to do so.

Students needing to leave school early are expected to leave an explanation of absence note signed by a parent/carer in the 'Leave Early Notes' tray outside the Student Services office in the morning. A pass will be generated by SASS staff and left in the pickup tray, which is to be shown to their teacher in order to leave class early.

Students who need to leave early during the course of the day (e.g. a parent calls and needs the student to return home) must see a deputy principal, who will give them permission to sign out. The student will then proceed to the front office to sign out.

Senior Students Flexible Leave Pass – Year 12 students may arrive at the beginning of period 2, and leave school early if they do not have a timetabled lesson according to 'Flexible leave pass – Senior Students' procedures. Students using a flexible leave pass must sign in and out of the front office upon arrival and departure.

We encourage parents to use the orange 'Absence Notification Booklet' available at student central (see below), rather than hand written notes, to inform the school of any absence. This will ensure the necessary and correct details are provided to our staff to process the absence.



Ask R U OK?

Start a conversation using these 4 steps



R U OK Day on the 12.9.19 is a special day in our school calendar, as it throws Wellbeing into the spotlight and promotes positive and proactive practices to increase holistic wellbeing. On the day we will be teaching an R U OK lesson to our year 7-10 cohorts. Students in years 7-8 (Stage 4) will complete a lesson tailored to their specific age group promoting positive

wellbeing practice. Years 9-10 will undertake a separate lesson that is catered to their specific age group.

The main message as a school that we wish to promote is around starting a conversation, not just on the 12th of September 2019 but on a daily basis and asking those around you 'R U OK?' and really listening to their response.

The four steps below are essential to that process.

- 1. Ask R U OK?
- 2. Listen
- 3. Encourage action
- 4. Check in

We understand that R U OK Day may be uncomfortable or painful for some people, we will be encouraging students to speak up if they are struggling and access support through the fabulous teaching staff and our Wellbeing services (HUB).



VALID Science for Year 10

The Validation of Assessment for Learning & Individual Development (VALID) test for Year 10 students will be held between Monday 2 September and Friday 13 September, 2019. The test takes approximately 70 minutes and will be run in Science classes. The VALID Science 10 test is an interactive, multimedia test completed entirely on computer.

VALID Science 10 contains multiple choice, short response and extended response tasks that are grouped around real-world issues, including scientific investigations. This is a diagnostic test, with tasks framed on Stage 5 outcomes and essential content in the NSW Science Years K-10 Syllabus. Students will be tested on their:

- · Knowledge and understanding of science
- Understanding and skills in the process of scientific investigation.
- Ability to evaluate evidence, make judgements and think critically.
- Ability to access information and communicate scientific ideas.

Students also complete a survey about their opinions, attitudes and values about science.

Each student is required to bring **headphones or earbuds** that plug into a school computer. Earbuds for an iPod or portable player are suitable.

If your child has a disability that needs special consideration or has been educated in English for less than one year, please contact the school to discuss special provisions or possible exemption from the test.

Results of the test will be available during Term 4, 2019. Information about each student is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that the right to privacy of all students is maintained. A personal report for each student will be sent to parents/carers to describe the science knowledge and skills demonstrated by the student in the test. There will also be information about how your child's results compare with the overall performance of all students in the test.

The School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using metro, train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance.

Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.



If you live too close to be eligible for free travel, you may still qualify for a School Term Bus Pass, which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term.

Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Op al card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at apps.transport.nsw.gov.aw/ssts

How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

Step 1

Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

Step 2

The school endorses your application.

Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.



A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over can apply for themselves.



Better together

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school. So it's a good idea to get a Child/Youth Opal card for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays.

Child/Youth Opal card benefits

- · Concession fares across the Opal network
- Half-price travel after eight paid journeys each week*
- \$1 transfer discount for every transfer between modes (metro/train, ferry, bus or light rail) as part of one Journey within 60 minutes from the last tap off[†]
- Set auto top up and link it to your credit or debit card so there's always enough value on the card to travel.

Secondary students aged 16 and over can travel with a Child/Youth Opal card when carrying a NSW/ACT Senior Secondary Student Concession Card, available from school offices.
