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# From the Principal's desk.....

A very warm welcome back to Term 3 and especially to the new members of the WHSPA community. This has been a particularly busy time for Year 12 who have been completing both their Practical and Written components of the Trial HSC. They move back in to regular timetabled classes in Week 3.

At present, we are organising the information sessions for Year 10 as they begin the process of selecting subjects for Year 11 2020. Mr O'Connor is coordinating these sessions and he has been putting together a series of information presentations for students and parents. The Year 10 students were all provided with the opportunity to attend Market Day subject sessions that were organised by Mrs Ireland. This was a chance for the students to gain an understanding of what the requirements are for the various subjects to be offered in 2020.

# Online Safety

Years 7-10 have experienced an Online Safety conversation/workshop delivered by our Police Liaison Officer, Sian Popp. Sian also ran a parent information stall at our Years 7-10 Parent Teacher Interviews.



The workshops covered the following items:

### Workshop Items:

- <u>Privacy Settings</u>: Ensuring all accounts are set to private to protect your identity, location, etc. The importance of only allowing people that you know to follow you "if you don't know them in the real world, don't accept them in your digital world". Grooming can take place if account settings are not properly set up and accounts set to private.
- PREPORT inappropriate online usage. Social media platforms have the ability to report inappropriate posts. It is important to remember to take a screenshot and report it to a Deputy Principal or directly to Police Liaison Officer. It is recommended that you block the user. Do not retaliate or get adults to retaliate on behalf. Simply take evidence to Deputy or Police Liaison Officer and they will deal with the issue directly. You can get in contact with the Police Liaison Officer through your local Police Station. You can also report inappropriate conduct through the E Safety Commissioner E-SAFETY LINK or Crime Stoppers CRIME STOPPERS LINK
- Do not feel under any pressure to do anything online that you don't feel comfortable with (sending pictures, engaging in inappropriate comments, etc.). You have a digital fingerprint- don't engage in anything that could be deemed inappropriate as it can come back to you.
- Be an upstander-report or support a friend if they have been the recipient of inappropriate behaviour (cyber bullying, etc.), help them report information to a Deputy, report online. The importance of not giving a reaction to the bully.




