NAPLAN

Recently, Years 7 and 9 parents would have received their child's NAPLAN results. Over the last two years, the staff at WHSPA have been involved in professional learning which focussed on embedding Literacy and Numeracy initiatives across all faculties within the school. WHSPA also formed a learning team to focus on analysing past NAPLAN data, looking at school wide practices which impact on NAPLAN and educating the relevant students in regard to why we sit NAPLAN exams and the necessary school-based reporting that is required on these tests. To say that WHSPA's 2022 results were impressive is a vast understatement. Students in Years 7 and 9 overwhelmingly demonstrated that their levels of achievement were trending upwards and were higher than both the Statistically Similar Schools Group and State Average NAPLAN scores in Reading, Writing, Grammar and Punctuation. Results in Spelling and Numeracy were trending upwards from previous years and were well above state average. People have many views of NAPLAN. I remind staff, students and parents that NAPLAN is one of the tools that we have to look at the impact of the incredible learning experiences that are offered to students at WHSPA.




