BLACKTOWN GIRLS & BOYS HIGH SCHOOLS

Outcome of consultation for coeducational high school options



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The NSW Department of Education has determined that Blacktown Boys High School and Blacktown Girls High School will remain as separate single-sex schools.

Adjustments will be made to surrounding intake areas to ensure all students in the Blacktown area have access to a co-educational high school option.

In response to feedback gathered during the consultation process, the department will also explore coeducational academic, sporting and extracurricular opportunities for students at Blacktown Boys and Blacktown Girls high schools and will work closely with both schools to identify and implement initiatives.

This outcome has been determined following careful review of feedback received from the Blacktown community during the consultation process and reflects the community's preference regarding local high school options.

Key changes:

The department has heard community feedback on proposed intake areas for surrounding high schools, presented during the consultation process.

The final intake areas for each school will be made available via <u>School</u> <u>Finder</u> and will be applied for any new enrolment application for 2026.

• The department will explore the introduction of co-educational learning opportunities to enhance curriculum

offerings at both schools, in collaboration with staff.
