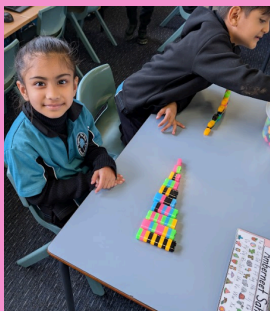

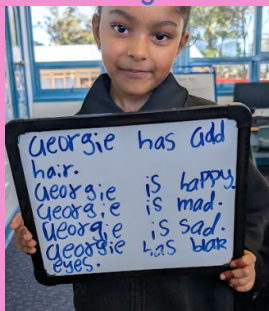

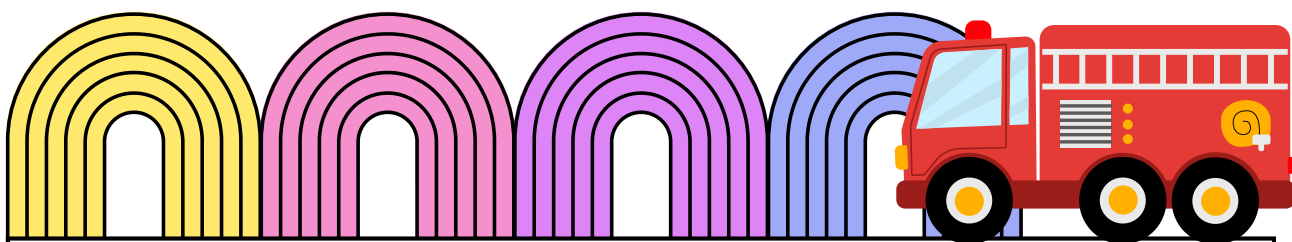

## PDH - FIRE SAFETY

In PDH this term, we have been learning all about fire safety. The children have enjoyed practising important safety strategies such as “Get down low and go, go, go” and learning the difference between good fires (like a campfire or stove) and bad fires (that are dangerous and need adult help). We have also talked about the importance of knowing how to dial 000 in an emergency.

This will be a wonderful opportunity for the children to meet real firefighters, ask questions, and see their equipment up close.

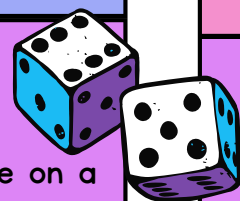


## SUPPORTING MATHS LEARNING AT HOME

Here are some fun ways to practise maths in everyday life:

- Count everything! Steps up the stairs, pieces of fruit, cars you see on a walk.
- Number hunts: Look for numbers on letterboxes, signs, or shopping aisles.
- Cooking together: Let your child measure ingredients, count scoops, or set the timer.
- Board games & dice: Games with counting, rolling dice, or moving spaces help build number sense.
- Sorting & grouping: Ask your child to sort toys, socks, or pantry items by size, colour, or shape.
- Money fun: Let your child help count coins when paying for small items.

Little and often makes a big difference!
