Curriculum update and ChiME

For many years, our Kindergarten to Year 2 students have participated in the ChiME (Childhood Music Education) program conducted by the Wollongong Conservatorium of Music. This initiative has been funded by the school, allowing students to explore music through singing, playing, moving, listening, and creating.

This year, however, we will not be continuing with this program as we are now working with a new Creative Arts syllabus. Our teachers are developing their own creative arts program based on this syllabus. Miss Fist will be leading music classes, Mrs Jacobs will focus on dance and Mrs Rodgers will teach drama to each of the K-2 classes over the next three terms, with each class spending a term with each teacher. Visual arts will be taught within each class.

In addition to the new Creative Arts syllabus, teachers are also working with the new syllabuses for Human Society and its Environment (History and Geography), Science and Technology, and Personal Development, Health and PE. With four new syllabuses, it's going to be a very busy year.

Uniform reminder and clothing pool request

A reminder that the Coniston Public School green polo as the gold/yellow polo shirt will be completely phased out by the end of 2025. NAPLAN 2025 parent and carer information

Each year the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is sat by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN 2025 will take place from **Wednesday 12 March** to **Monday 24 March**.

NAPLAN is just one part of our school's learning assessment program. The tests assess literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school, so the best preparation is their everyday classroom learning. Our school will also undertake activities to help students become familiar with the types of questions and tools available in the online tests.

To be elected or to vote as a general member, you must become a financial member. Please bring along your \$1 on the night. We will have the membership form ready for you to complete.


