Attendance – Every day counts!



Did you know that if your child arrives after the 8:55 morning bell, they are late to school? If this is your child, they must attend the office for a late arrival slip to pass to the teacher. In most cases, late arrivals are unexplained absences. Ideally, an adult should attend the office with their child if they are late to school.

If your child is late, they miss the first part of learning for the day that often involves setting up the day and reviewing previous learning. As a result, they can be confused about what is occurring. Children who arrive late are also often embarrassed to enter the classroom.



The attendance graph below is for the period 12 - 25 June 2025. The red line is the NSW Department of Education's expected 95% attendance marker.

Our school hat is approved by the Cancer Council and available for purchase at the office or Lowes Figtree. To help your child locate their hat if it goes missing, please ensure their name is clearly visible on the inside.

Children who do not wear a school hat (part of our uniform) are permitted to play quiet games in a small part of the playground. This means they miss out on games such as basketball, handball or soccer, and opportunities to create with the musical instruments, in the sandpit or in other parts of the playground.

Student Reports to Parents - issued Friday 4 July (last day of Term 2)

Next Friday, your child will bring home their Semester 1 Student Report to Parents. We hope you are as proud of your child's achievements as we are.

For students in Years 1 - 6, the Department of Education has made some changes to the way we need to report. Students in Years 1 - 6 now only have a comment for English and mathematics as well as a general comment. For the other key learning areas, we are required to provide achievement grades while effort grades are optional. Additionally, the achievement grade 'sound' has been changed to 'expected' with some of the wording for the achievement grades updated.

The Kindergarten report has a comment for each key learning area as well as a general comment. Effort is indicated for English and mathematics.

For all students, there are fewer 'social development' and 'commitment to learning' areas. These are now tailored to what is expected for the age of the student. Parent feedback in 2022 was used as part of this process.

If your child has an individual learning plan due to disability, commenced at our school recently or, is newly arrived with English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D), their report may look a little different to the above. For other EAL/D students, the report contains specific information about the supports provided at school and/or your child's progress.

Attendance, including partial attendance is included on all reports and has been calculated as at Friday 20 June 2025.

Thank you to the P&C for their input into our new look school report and thank you to the Executive Leadership Team, especially Mr Whittaker, for putting it together.

As always, extensive proofreading of reports has taken place but if you find an error, please let us know early next term so we can rectify and reprint.

K – 2 Creative Arts

Kindergarten

Kindergarten have thoroughly enjoyed their music lessons this term! They listen and respond to music, often watching the ABC education program Let's Sing! where Andy's music class is a fantastic springboard into the lesson. They have explored musical concepts, such as, timbre, ostinato, beat, rhythm and melody. Kindergarten students have used real instruments like ukuleles, conga drums, voices and percussion instruments. They have also used home-made instruments like pool noodles for drumming practice!





Year 1

In 1R we have been learning about and performing drama. We have been exploring movement and voice, role play, improvisation and collaborative drama. In this week's session, our groups created a phrase and had selected cards to work through which gave them a particular way to say the phrase. For example, saying the phrase "It is going to rain today" and saying it as though it's the most important news you have ever received, or as if they were really cranky. One particular group picked the phrase "I've just done a backflip for the first time" and they needed to say it as though they were elderly.

They are having a wonderful time expressing themselves through drama and are enjoying some time to be a bit silly and have fun with it.



Year 2

This term, Year 2 have been participating in Dance as part of the Creative and Performing Arts curriculum. Students have been exploring a range of simple line dances, as well as individual and partner-based movements. Through these experiences, they have been developing their awareness of the elements of dance, including space, dynamics, time, and relationships. Students are learning to respond to rhythm, follow structured movement sequences, and express ideas through body movement in both guided and creative ways, in alignment with Stage 1 Dance outcomes.
