Staff professional learning

To ensure our staff are highly qualified, they engage regularly in professional learning, mostly outside of school hours.

Staff have recently completed their cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and anaphylaxis training as well as their mandatary training, including Child Protection and Code of Conduct.

This year we will develop a deeper understanding of the new syllabuses for Creative Arts, Science and Technology, Human Society and its Environment (HSIE), and Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE).

In addition, the teachers will deepen their knowledge and skills regarding explicit teaching while classroom staff will delve into the Resilience Project that is being introduced across the school.

NAPLAN 2025

parent and carer information

Each year the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is sat by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN 2025 will take place from Wednesday 12 March to Monday 24 March.

NAPLAN is just one part of our school's learning assessment program. The tests assess literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school, so the best preparation is their everyday classroom learning. Our school will also undertake activities to help students become familiar with the types of questions and tools available in the online tests.
