














Free child car seat safety check

No stoppingsign

No stopping' sign means you must not stop at any point on the road or kerb in the direction of the arrow, unless in an emergency.

No stopping' areas are sometimes marked by on unbroken yellowedge line.

Restrictions may apply at certain times only Hours of operation may apply to some signs.

- Disabey No Stopping sign

Childrens crossings

Children's crossings are part-time crossings. They usually operate during school zone hours, and at other approved times and locations. When a children's crossing is operating, it's marked by red orange flags at both sides. When you see the Rops, you must slow down and stop before the white stopes or "sop line to give way to pedestrians. You must remain at a complete stop until all pedestrians have left. the crossing.

If the flags are not displayed, it's not operating as a children's crossing.

Some children's crossings are controlled by school crossing supervisors. When you see a supervisor holding a "Sop – children crossing" sign, you must slow down and stop.

You must remain at a complete stop until:

- All pedestrians have left the crossing, and the school cressing supervisor is no longer showing the sign.
- Sup on or near pedestrian crossing from \$403 and 3 dement points.
- Sop on or near pedestrian crossing (school zone) from \$502 and 2 dement points.
- Stop on or near children's crossing from \$423 and 2 dement points.
- Sap on or near children's crossing (school sone) from \$562 and 2 dement points.



Porking within 10 metres of an intersecting road at an intersection without treffic lights is on oftence unless the posted sign states otherwise

Parking within 20 metres of an intersecting road with traffic lights is an offence unless. the protect sign states otherwise.

Obstructing driveways, ramps, paths, and passageways

Why is it illegal?

Obstructing a dissessy even if it is to your own property is an otheroe as if prohibits access for emergency services such as the police, fire and reaces and ambulance.

Double Parking

You must not stop or park your vehicle: alongside another parked vehicle (double park) scross a driveway unless you've picking up or dropping off passengers on a median strip.

- Double Park from \$330.
- Double Park (school zine) from \$422 and 2 dement points.
